Research tells us that that one million new neural connections are formed every second during a child's first years; these precious days of early childhood development are more important than any other in positioning a child for a productive, successful life.

This past year, VOCEL strengthened its commitment to ensure that all children have the skills they need to thrive in school and succeed in life, regardless of the zip code in which they reside. After three years in development, we expanded our Child Parent Academy from two to eight sites in some of Chicago's most under-resourced communities. This reflects our belief that the best way to fully capitalize on the powerful early years is to empower parents with strategies to develop their children's communication, interpersonal, and executive function skills so they can flourish.

Our innovative approach is grounded in research-based best practices. By sharing it directly with parents in a community-based setting, we're equipping them with the tools they need to be their children's first and best teachers. But even more, we're creating supportive environments for caregivers to learn from each other, share what works, and become confident early advocates for their children.

With your support, we're seeing promising evidence that children are not only entering school prepared, but also that families and communities are becoming stronger. Thank you for helping our youngest learners and their parents thrive.

# We're changing the status quo for early learning in Chicago.

Access to best-in-class early learning opportunities has the greatest potential to break generational cycles of poverty. And yet, early education programs are often out of reach for many families in Chicago. In 2018, after three years of ideation, testing, and iteration, we transitioned our programming focus to the Child Parent Academy, a dynamic learning accelerator where young children ages zero to three and their parents learn side-by-side.

#### - VOCEL'S CORE STRATEGIES

Our model is informed by multiple lenses, including brain science, economics, child development, parenting best practices, and on-the-ground experience.

#### TWO-GENERATIONAL AND COMMUNITY-BASED

Intentionally designed programming for child and parent that increases access to early education in underresourced neighborhoods.

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## EVALUATION AND RESPONSIBLE GROWTH

Constant evaluation and iteration drives program efficacy and strategic expansion efforts.

#### OUTCOMES-DRIVEN PROGRAMMING

With a commitment to measuring outcomes, VOCEL monitors and tracks child and parent progress and adjusts course to ensure results.

## CONTINUOUS AND STRATEGIC INNOVATION

We look to advancements in the field and participant input to refine our program and adapt to families' changing needs.

# Over 10 months, parents and children meet weekly at sites across Chicago's south and west sides.

#### CLASSES AT PARTNER SITES -SCHOOLS & COMMUNITY CENTERS

# 1. Learning together

Children and their caregivers convene weekly with VOCEL teachers to learn through play and interaction. Parents observe teachers in action and see how they model key concepts.

# 2. Fostering independence

Children practice separation and continue learning with VOCEL staff and volunteers while parents and caregivers separate for discussion time.



#### 3. Building connections and gaining knowledge

Parents and caregivers meet to converse as a community of peers and discuss child development milestones with VOCEL's Family Support Team.

### 4. Sparking discovery at home

Families take home VOCEL's curated Brain Bags with learning tools and books that encourage discovery and language development. In partnership with research-based Ready4K, parents receive texts throughout the week that prompt parent-child interactions and promote learning.

# 5. Connecting families with hard-to-access resources

VOCEL's Family Support Team partners with mental health, employment, and other community programs to secure additional resources and support as needed.

# At the conclusion of the 10-month program:



93% of parents say their knowledge of child development increased.

83% of parents say they now have more support from other parents.

# Meeting families where they are.

Only 22 percent of children in Chicago enter kindergarten on track to learn.<sup>1</sup>

And yet, outside of formal daycare, parents who want early learning opportunities for their children ages zero to three (when brain development is most critical) don't have access. The Child Parent Academy was designed in response to this need. We partner with schools and community-based organizations in under-resourced communities to coach caregivers to become exemplary teachers during the critical early years so their children start school ready on day one.

WHERE WE WORK

In 2018, the Child Parent Academy grew to eight sites in some of our city's most under-resourced neighborhoods.

## PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: ONEW COAST FOUNDATION


# We are excited to announce our selection as the inaugural investment of Chicago's newest venture philanthropic fund.

In January 2018, the New Coast and Skender Foundations formed a strategic partnership to pool funding and resources to support an emerging nonprofit organization in Chicago working to alleviate poverty. After a rigorous vetting process, VOCEL was selected as the venture fund's inaugural investment, receiving \$300,000 of general operating grants over three years, along with additional resources and access to networks to fuel our growth.


