It has been five years since we first piloted our early education program, and we are proud to share that 2019 was a breakthrough year for VOCEL. We doubled the number of children and parents we serve in the Child Parent Academy. We launched a new initiative to coach Chicago Public Schools principals on our approach to early learning. And we began to share our model on a national level as part of Frontiers of Innovation at Harvard University's Center on the Developing Child.

As much as we worked to deliver external growth, however, we also joined as a team to further cultivate the people, culture, and beliefs that define us as an organization. We know that the return on this investment will be significant in the years to come, aligning how and where we innovate and keeping us focused on our purpose and mission as we continue to grow.



We're bringing quality early learning to more families in more communities across Chicago.

We added seven new Child Parent Academy school partners in 2019, allowing us to serve 150 families and marking a 650 percent growth in our geographic reach since the program's inception in 2016. Our expansion has strategically targeted communities that 1) are growing in population of households with children under the age of five; 2) have limited access to early learning opportunities; and 3) have a higher density of low-income households.

We believe learning should be hands-on, messy, and fun.


Our innovative approach is grounded in child development, attachment, and pedagogy. As their first and best teachers, parents receive insights and support to help their children develop capabilities that promote academic success.

PRESCHOOL READINESS & PARENT RESPONSIVENESS

In the 2018-2019 school year, we served 75 families who met weekly for 10 months at eight different sites. We measured their proficiencies at the beginning and end of the session.

Progress Towards Preschool Readiness: Average proficiency on VOCEL's measures of preschool readiness in children



ENGAGING WITH FRONTIERS OF INNOVATION





How we're building our programs to achieve breakthrough outcomes.

At Harvard University's Center on the Developing Child, leading researchers and early education experts are working to drive science-based innovation that achieves breakthrough outcomes for children and families facing adversity.

In 2019, VOCEL was invited into the Center's **Frontiers of Innovation Learning Community**, a cohort of on-the-ground initiatives determined to have the potential to achieve population-level impact at scale. Over the last 10 months, we've been working with the Center's team to calibrate and expand our evaluation models and then use these findings to refine our program design to increase impact.

ABOUT THE FRONTIERS OF INNOVATION LEARNING COMMUNITY

The Frontiers of Innovation Learning Community is a diverse cadre of early-stage programs that have the potential to catalyze new developments in the field of early education. While no two projects in the portfolio look the same, all share an overarching theory of change, which hypothesizes that in order to achieve breakthrough outcomes for children, we must actively build the self-regulation skills, executive functioning, and mental health of the adults who care for them.







We're sharing our approach with the people and environments that impact Chicago's youngest learners.

In the fall of 2019, Chicago Public Schools rolled out an exciting and ambitious plan to make full-day preschool available to every four-year-old in Chicago. With 2,800 new preschool seats, public elementary schools across the city are expanding their programs, staff, and buildings to reach the youngest learners.

With support from The Chicago Public Education Fund, VOCEL is piloting the **Building Early Learning Leaders** (BELL) initiative, a new principal-coaching program where we share our early learning philosophy to create strong and vibrant pre-K classroom environments in Chicago public schools.

VOCEL'S EARLY LEARNING PHILOSOPHY

We believe young children learn best in the context of relationships and environments where there are three key characteristics:



High levels of emotional support.



Many opportunities for children to be creative, experiment, and own their learning.



Frequent and robust communication between adults and children, and among children.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS

We hosted the inaugural session of VOCEL's **Summer Fam Bam** at our headquarters in the Austin neighborhood. Over 40 children, parents, and caregivers engaged in playbased classes.





VOCEL's team and representatives attended 18 community festivals and back-to-school events **reaching over 800 community members** and promoting VOCEL's programming.




